Today you are looking for examples of figurative language in the descriptions of the bombing in the book. Here are some examples of figurative lanaguage. Can you find any examples in the descriptions below? What else makes the descriptions a good setting?

Simile – When you compare two things to each other (usually involves the words "as" or "like" – it sped of as fast as a cheetah

Metaphor – When you say something IS something else. – Jack is a busy bee. **Personification** – When you given human qualities to an object or animal – The grass tickled my feet.

Alliteration – When words next to each other start with the same sound - Pretty purple purses, dreary dismal darkness.

Onomatopoeia - When a word makes the sound that it is describing - Crash! Bang!

This part of the road had already been badly hit. The air was thick with brick dust and smoke, making me cough horribly.
