
Torak Class information

In maths, the children used their knowledge of the properties of 3D shapes to make their own, using paper straws and bluetac.








Kendrick School - Admission into Year 7 in September 2021

Virtual Open Event – Thursday 21st May 2020 at 5pm Online application form available on our website from: Friday 1st May 2020 Deadline to apply: Wednesday 1st July 2020

The Open Event for entry into Year 7 in September 2021 planned to take place on **Thursday 30th April 2020** was cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

However, you are invited to attend a **remote Open Evening on Thursday 21st May 2020** at **5pm**. This will take the form of a Webinar hosted by Cisco and will include talks from the Headteacher and students, followed by presentations on the curriculum and the admission process. There will be an opportunity to ask questions (typed) during the event and if we are not able to answer the question at the time, a list of Q&As will be available on our website after the event. It will not last any longer than one hour. The event will be recorded so if you are unable to join live, you can catch up on it at a later date. **To register for the event please click on this link or visit our website.**

It is likely you will need to download an app if you are using your mobile device or a browser plug in if you are using a laptop or PC. We recommend you follow the link to join the event when you receive the confirmation email so that you are prepared in advance. Please note that the event will not have started but will just ensure you the necessary software installed.

We will be happy to help you with any queries you have on this but please do bear with us as we are extremely busy at the moment.

Admission to Year 7 in September 2021 is by entrance examination. The test consists of two papers assessing verbal, numerical and non-verbal ability. Familiarisation booklets are available on our website via this <u>link</u>.

Testing will take place on **Saturday 12th September 2020** at Kendrick School, and parents will be able to register their child online for the test from **Friday 1st May 2020** and no later than **midnight on midnight Wednesday 1st July 2020**. Parents will receive notification of the test outcome prior to the deadline for completion of the Common Application Form.

Students who are eligible for the pupil premium or service premium or is a child in care, and living within the schools' designated area, will be prioritised for admission and the qualifying score will be lowered by 5 marks for these students. Kendrick School operate a designated area as part of our respective oversubscription criteria. The address which will be used for consideration for this purpose will be the applicant's permanent address at 31st August 2020.
