Staff appointments

I am so very pleased to be able to tell you that we are now fully staffed for September.

The final piece in our staffing jigsaw was put in place yesterday when we appointed Mrs Nicola Edwards as the new Teacher for Torak class.

Mrs Edwards came into teaching via the route of being an Emotional Literacy Support Assistant in school. This is the same role as Mrs Wheeler has at Beenham. Not only did it give Mrs Edwards the grounding and pre-requisite skills that she needed to be a teacher, she comes to Beenham with a real strength in nurturing children, managing their emotional wellbeing and behaviour, and also being able to create a learning environment where children can feel safe, happy and ready to learn.

We are absolutely thrilled with both the appointments that we have made and are now able to focus on moving forward to September.

Classes for September will be:

Mai class: Years R, 1 and 2 taught by Mrs Cannings Torak class: Years 3 and 4 taught by Mrs Edwards Mosi class: Years 5 and 6 taught by Miss McBean

What will the rest of the Summer term look like at Beenham Primary School?

Home learning

We will continue to upload learning onto our website until the end of term. This is for children who continue to learn at home and for those returning to school.

You will also notice that the learning will become much easier from Monday 29th June. This is in recognition that we are nearing the end of the academic year and learning always eases off in school at this time.

We are also aware just how hard everyone has worked over the last 4 months. It has been a very intense time. Whilst we will continue to post learning on the website, please note that it is not compulsory. At this stage, it may be better for you and your child to go out for a walk together or play a game in the sunshine. The aim is to keep things happy and buoyant and not to cause tension in your household.

I am already working on catch up plans for all children in September so please, please don't worry if you can't get your child to undertake the home learning anymore. Parents you have all done an amazing job as teachers, I wish there was a special award I could give you all. I am so proud of the parents in the Beenham School community and what you have achieved during the lock down period.

Returning to school

School is now open for children in years R, 1 and 6, as well as vulnerable pupils and children of key workers.

Now that we have appointed two new teachers, we are able to consider a plan to be able to invite other year groups back into school before the end of the Summer term.

The current plan, which I will finalise in the newsletter next Friday is to offer some morning sessions to children in years 2. 3 4 and 5. They will have the opportunity to work with their new teacher in their new classroom during the sessions. The dates and times will be as follows:

Tuesday 7th July – 8.25am until 12pm – All of Torak and half of Mosi Thursday 9th July– 8.25am until 12pm - All of Torak and half of Mosi Tuesday 14th July– 8.25am until 12pm – All of Torak class and half of Mosi Thursday 16th July– 8.25am until 12pm - All of Torak and half of Mosi

We will finalise details in next week's newsletter. At that time we will let children in Mosi class know which group they will be in for their return.

Summer holiday provision

Some of the larger schools will be offering summer holiday provision for pupils at their schools. At Beenham we have decided to close for the summer holiday to give families a break from learning and to allow teachers time to recharge their batteries and work on plans for September.

However, I will be working during the week before we return to school. Other adults will also take it in turns to be in school during that time so I am not lone working. At this time, I will be inviting selected SEN and vulnerable pupils to come into school, on a one to one basis, for a couple of hours each. I will be undertaking a simple literacy and maths assessment to ascertain the gaps in basic skills. This will enable me to write some intervention programmes and new SAPs, that we can implement from the first week back in the Autumn term.

Planning for the Autumn term

As you can imagine, this is going to be a mammoth task. There will be a good deal of missing skills in pupils when they return to school in September. Not only will we have to plan regular learning, we will need to think about a strategy to address the gaps.

I will need to send teachers off for the Summer with a strategy to support their planning for the Autumn term. With this in mind, I have decided to close the school for an additional day on Monday 6th July. We will still post home learning on the website but will be unable to welcome other children into school as we won't have the manpower to provide the required health and safety levels. I do apologise profusely for this but I can't see another way around it.

Please let me know if you are a key worker and this causes you a childcare issue.

LAPTOPS

Finally, during the last week of term, we will be providing learning that will not require a laptop. This will enable us to collect all school laptops back in before the end of term. If you foresee a problem in getting the laptop you have back to us, then let Mrs Sharp know and we will arrange to collect it from you.

Mai Class news




Mrs Cannings and I have been very impressed by the way everyone has settled back in to school and by the great work you have all been doing.

Keep up the good work everyone.












Torak Class news

The 2020 digital Summer Reading Challenge is now live!

The theme for this year's challenge is 'Silly Squad': a celebration of funny books, happiness and laughter. Children can sign up to take part at https://summerreadingchallenge.org.uk. When they do so, they will need to include an email address for a parent or carer. Their parent/carer will then be contacted by The Reading Agency and will need to sign up on their own account and give permission for their child to take part in order to complete the registration process. Please note that as part of their sign up, children need to create their own, unique UserName and to select West Berkshire as their place of residence. However, no personal names are used on the public website.

For the digital challenge, children can set their own reading targets regarding the number of books they hope to read before September. This can be as few or as many as families think practical, although we recommend 6 books as usual. The books don't need to be library books - they can be books from home, from school or anywhere else, including e-books and audiobooks.

As they progress through the digital challenge and rate and review their books, children will unlock a range of games, quizzes and exciting video content. A downloadable certificate will be available to anyone who completes their challenge and perhaps this is something that your pupils may like to bring into school in the autumn? There is also a School Zone on the Summer Reading Challenge website, where you can find downloadable activities and other resources to help inspire your pupils to read for pleasure.

Once our Order and Collect service is operational, families will be able to request books from us, either online or by telephoning their local library. For those who are unable to take part in the digital **Summer Reading Challenge**, we will have a simple, printed form that they can complete with details of any 6 books that they have read this summer. Certificates will also be available for those who return completed forms to us - but sorry, there are no medals or other prizes this year!

I do hope that your pupils will enjoy this year's challenge and that you find it useful. Throughout the summer, West Berkshire Libraries will continue with our own programme of online events and activities for children as well, which include digital Storytimes on Fridays and weekly book-related craft activities.
