Cont...

Our value for this month is self-belief. We are aware that the lockdown has eroded the self-esteem of many children in different ways. For some children it was a big step in coming back to school this week... both in terms of facing new learning and also picking up and re-building old and new friendships. We will be trying to equip all children with the tools that they need to begin to rebuild their place in school, in terms of learning, confidence and relationships with others.

With this in mind, we have developed something called a "Recovery Curriculum" which will underpin all our work in school. I will write and explain more about this in next week's newsletter.

Finally, I'm sure you will have seen on Twitter and the children will have told you, we are working hard to develop our confidence as a school in using Microsoft TEAMS.

We have already used it to enable a child who is absent from school at the moment, to join in with lessons with his class. This morning I also managed to stream a whole school assembly into each class using TEAMS.

Our aim is to use the platform to enable any child who has to self-isolate, to engage with classroom learning if they are absent from school. We are also aiming to hold parent assemblies in a couple of weeks via TEAMS, once we are up to speed.

Drop off and pick up from school

Firstly, I would like to thank you all for following our social distancing guidance whilst arriving and queuing on the school premises.

I would be grateful however, if you could leave the site and go home, as soon as you have dropped off your children. It was brought to my attention earlier in the week that some of you are lingering in groups outside of school.

We have deliberately staggered drop off and collection times so that we don't have too many adults in a group at one time, either on or off school premises. In addition, pre-school have to bring their children in each day. On a couple of occasions last week, school parents were congregating in a group at the gateway to school at a time when pre-school families were then arriving. Not only is this unnerving for some, this virus hasn't gone away . . . we need to work very hard to prevent a spread.

I can hear myself having a moan and I'm sorry . . . <u>but if schools are to remain open</u> then we need to do our bit. There are cases of the virus out there and locally too. We must adhere to the social distancing rules.

Finally, I have been asked by several parents, if we would allow parents who have siblings in other classes as well as Mai, if they can drop both children off at the same time. We are still trying to integrate the new children in as well so I would ask if you could bear with us for one more week with the current arrangements and I will review next Friday.

Finally, can I please ask that you drop your child off or come onto the school site no earlier than 5 minutes before the start of the school day.

Many thanks for your co-operation in all areas.

They were all fantastic! Great Job Torak 👈



Please see attached to this newsletter a menu for the new catering company.

Unfortunately, you will be unable to pre order your child's meal with them at home as the online system is purely for adding payments to your child's account. With this in mind, you may wish to go through with your child what they will expect to see on the menu when they choose their lunch in school each day.

The online payment system is now set up so please follow the instructions in the email Mrs Appleby sent out to ensure that your child has enough money on their account. Year R, 1 and 2 are entitled to universal infant free school meals so you will not need to top up with any money. If your child is entitled to free school meals, again you will not need to top up the account with any money.

Free School Meals / Pupil Premium

Additional money for schools

The Pupil Premium is the government's name for a sum of extra money that's paid to schools to help with costs. It can help to pay for important things, like school trips, uniforms and PE kit, music lessons, and additional help with subjects like English and Maths.

It's there to help support children from lower income families, so the government uses information about children that are entitled to free school meals to work out where, and how much, to pay.

Free school meals and Pupil Premium

Getting the right information to make sure that Pupil Premium money can be claimed for your child is sometimes complicated for schools.

When a child applies successfully for a free school meal, their application includes allocation of Pupil Premium money for the school.

However:

- some children don't claim for the meal for instance because they bring a packed lunch
- and all children under the age of 7 are given a free school meal automatically they don't need to apply

Both of these situations mean that Schools miss out on funding because they don't have the right information from parents that would enable them to apply for the Pupil Premium.

Free School Meals (FSM) are provided to children whose parents/guardians are in receipt of:

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
- Income Support
- Income Based Job Seekers Allowance*
- Income related Employment Support Allowance
- support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 (from the National Asylum Support Service)
- the guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit, provided you're **not also entitled to Working Tax Credit** and have an annual income of no more than £16,190
- Working tax credit run on-paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

Applying for Free School Meals through West Berkshire Council:

To apply for free school meals at West Berkshire schools and maintained nurseries:

- Apply online it's quick and easy and you can do this at any time that is convenient for you we'll
 contact you about your application and to confirm that you qualify.
- <u>Apply over the phone through Customer Services</u> we'll take you through the form for you right there and then just have your National Insurance number ready.

^{*}Children who receive Income Based Job Seekers Allowance in their own right are also eligible to receive free school lunches.
