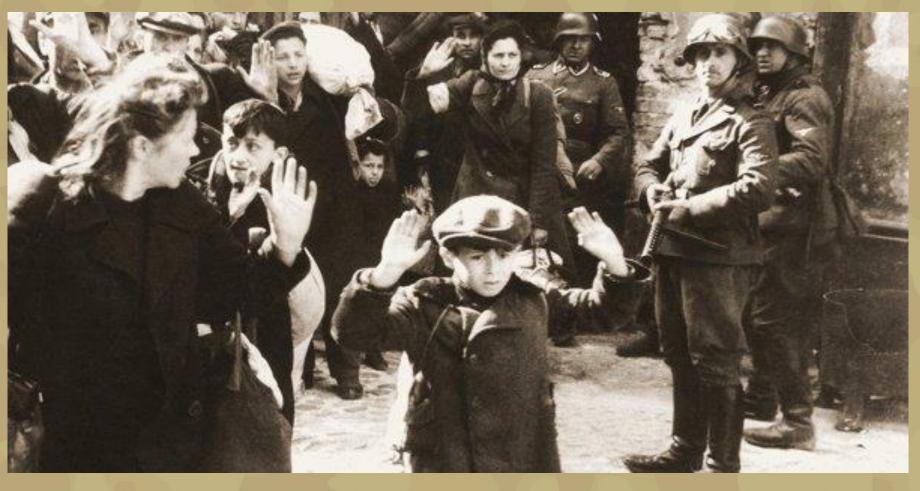






























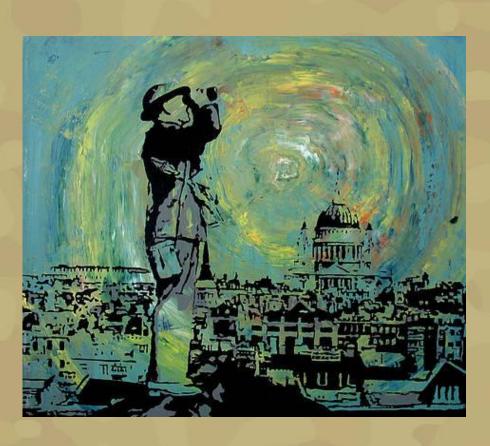

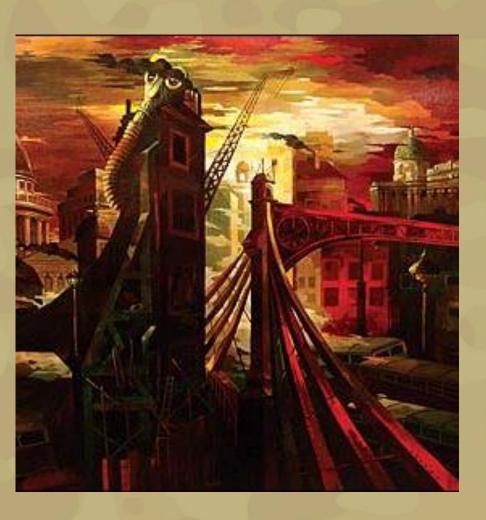
World War II Watchman Over London



 What do you think the artist is trying to portray?



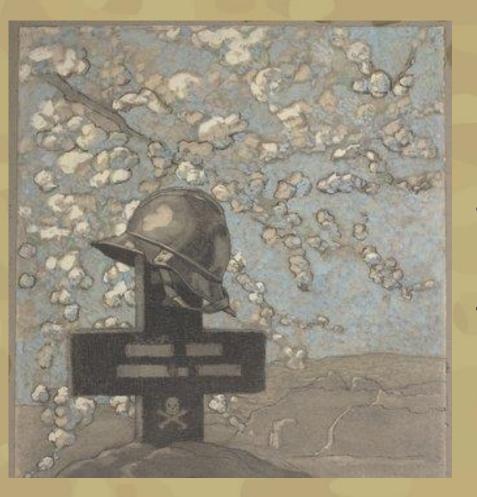

Lots of artists use symbols such as the cross to express their feelings.

This painting uses the cross to represent loss.



Pablo Picasso 'Guernica'



This famous piece by Pablo Picasso uses symbolism in a different way to represent loss and suffering by both humans and animals in war.



War artists often choose dark colours to represent their emotions and the destruction caused by war







Some artists use sculpture to create lasting images of war.

What emotions will you portray and how will you portray them?

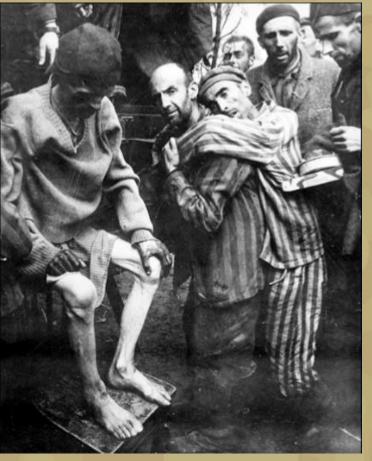






Use the pictures on the following slides to help you plan your piece of art.
